APPLICATION FORM**

Introduction

The **APPG Excellence in School Food Awards 2023/2024** recognise excellence in innovation, individual commitment and provide an opportunity for those working within school food a chance to step forward and shine.

Guidance notes

- Submissions must be no more than 500 words (excluding the wording in the template)
- The 100-word executive summary is compulsory
- The overall file size should be no larger than 2MB
- Up to 2 photos can be submitted (up to 2MB)
- Submissions will be marked by independent judges using a standard scoring template.
- Each submission must have a title and contact details
- Submissions will not be accepted unless accompanied by a covering signed letter from an MP
- A maximum of 3 submissions per MP will be accepted
- Projects submitted to the awards must have been active in the last 12 months

Scoring matrix

- 1 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY UP TO 10%**
Is the summary clear and concise? Are all key components of the submission identified?
- 2 BACKGROUND UP TO 30%**
Is the content explained? Are aims and objectives highlighted? Are initial problems and barriers noted and the methods of overcoming them detailed?
- 3 WHAT HAS BEEN ACHIEVED IN THE LAST 12 MONTHS UP TO 60%**
What are the benefits? Is there evidence?

The judges will be looking for clear evidence that your submission meets the criteria set out in this guidance and reflects the provision of an excellent service.

Date for submission & presentation

Submissions close at 3pm on Monday 11 December 2023 and must follow the submission template and be accompanied by a letter from an MP.
