




How is the meals service organised



When are meals delivered




How are meals delivered

- Local government finance

- Inflationary costs



Benefits

- Support with cost of living
- Supporting independent living
- Reduces Ioneliness

Conclusions

- Local authorities providing the service has declined from 66% in 2014 to 29% in 2023
- The UK average for the cost of a two-course meal has increased from £4.03 in 2018 to £4.81 in 2023
- Meals on Wheels provide an essential preventative service
- Meals on Wheels is element of the solution for wider council strategies
- NHS funding is not used to support the service
- Increased budget pressures are resulting in councils reviewing their provision
