

- Social enterprise / community-led companies



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Challenges

- Funding not keeping pace with overheads
- Funding disparities
- Funding not being ring-fenced
- Changes in government policy
- Academisation
- Disconnect between awarding bodies
- Flexibility, resilience and responsiveness to the sector

Recommendations

- 1. The wide-reaching socio-economic value of school catering needs to be recognised
- Funding should reflect the broader value of school catering rather than simply the cost of the school meal
- 3. Funding for school meals needs to be ringfenced
- 4. Market-based models do not serve the sector well and ought to be reevaluated.
- 5. Subsidy is not a dirty word

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
