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
## The labour market

The UK's population is ageing, and businesses are already experiencing high levels of job vacancies.

About 1 in 4 people in the UK aren't working. Of that group, only about 1 in 5 are officially *unemployed*.

The rest are "economically inactive", which means they're not actively job-seeking.

# What is economic inactivity?

To understand economic inactivity, it's helpful to think in terms of:

- People who don't need to work
- People who are unable to work
- People who need help to work
- People who don't want to work

This challenge varies regionally. Our post-pandemic recovery in the UK was worse than elsewhere, and far more people are falling out of work due to sickness (which impacts on caring responsibilities too).

# **SY's Proof of Concept**

The model will:

- **1. Sort the system**: building capacity through a system steward at the regional level and a system manager at the local level to fix the fragmentation issues.
- 2. Prepare the jobs: innovating with businesses to build training and roles for people who've been out of work for some time.
- **3. Journey with people:** recruiting system navigators to journey with people one-to-one through their pathway to work, accessing the help they need and finding good employment.
- **4. Work upstream:** investing in prevention by getting partners on board with a youth guarantee and a good employer charter.
- **5. Invest in data**: Collecting, integrating and using data better across the system to monitor the quality of support and identify those who need help to work at the right time.

# **Funding for the Proof of Concept**

Throughout South Yorkshire, the Proof-of-Concept aims to place **10,000 economically inactive individuals into work** and **prevent 3,800 residents from falling out of work** over four years. This means getting 2,000 Barnsley residents in work.

#### Autumn 2024

- South Yorkshire received funding as one of the eight economic inactivity trailblazers for 12 months.
- South Yorkshire ICB received funding as a Health and Growth Accelerator for 12 months.
   Prevention focus to limit work exits.

#### **Spring 2025**

Funding for year two of the economic inactivity trailblazer confirmed.












# What sits behind Pathways to Work?















#### Commissioned provision

Personalised support for those with:

#### Who we support



#### **Economically inactive**

People aged 16 and over who are not in work, not actively seeking work, and not available to start work within the next two weeks.



#### Unemployed

People who are not currently in work, but are actively looking for a job and are available to start.



In work

Those in low paid, insecure or low skilled employment who are looking to advance their career.

### **Employment and skills support**



All participants can access physiotherapy and solution-focused therapy.

We also offer wellbeing courses to help build resilience, confidence, and a positive mindset to support progress into learning or work.



#### Skills

People can start learning in a safe, supportive space to help build the skills, behaviours and attitudes that Barnsley employers look for.

From English and digital skills to entry level qualifications and workplace safety training.



We offer learning, volunteering and training to move into work. This includes career advice, CV support and job search assistance.

We also help with interview preparation from interview clothes to a bus pass.
