

### What is it?



The Carbon Leadership Programme is a 3-year programme that will fund local highway authorities in England to measure and identify how to reduce their carbon emissions using a simple, standardised methodology.



### Who's it for?


- All local highway authorities across
   England are eligible to participate – and it's free.
- It will provide DfT with critical information regarding the carbon profile of local roads.





### Where's it come from?





2021:

Awareness, readiness, tools and processes.

2022:

LHA-specific standards for carbon analysis.

2023:

CCAS support instrument carbon calculator.

2024 - 2026:

LHA-hosted research projects.

2025:

National carbon assessments and benchmarks.

### **Key features**


The Carbon Leadership Programme will allow local highway authorities to:

- Measure and evidence carbon emissions accurately
- Develop practical strategies for emission reductions
- Improve operational efficiency
- Demonstrate environmental leadership
- Make progress towards net zero targets



### One Programme, Two Assessments





Combined, these two assessments can be used to define practical steps towards reducing the carbon footprint of local highway services (construction & maintenance).

The programme's process has been designed to answer two key questions:

- What is our current carbon footprint?
- What are we doing to reduce future carbon emissions and what can we learn from others to help us do more?

### How does it work?



- Self-assessment proforma training (0.5 days, online)
- Proformas completed in-house (90 days allocated, 4/5 days required)
  - >Using readily available data, inc. meter readings & standard KPIs
  - ➤ Support available where required
- Proforma submissions and independent reviews (1.5 days)
  - > Includes error resolutions and gap closing
- Follow-up workshops (0.5 days, senior staff)
  - >Assessment reviews and certification
