The environment within which building maintenance and housing services are being delivered is changing quickly. This seminar will enable managers and elected members with responsibility for these and related services to keep up to date with developments and to learn from the experience of others in the sector. Welfare reform is at the top of the list including the impacts for landlords, pressures on rent collection arrangements, the potential outcomes in terms of increased arrears and impact on Local Authority temporary accommodation. Challenging carbon emission reduction targets are also not going away and the building and housing services have key roles to play in helping achieve these. Carbon reduction, renewables and energy efficiency is now a core element of what Councils are expected to deliver. This is reflected in Scottish Governments Low Carbon Scotland report which highlighted Scottish Government is investing over £1.14 billion over the next three years on measures to address climate change. As well as Scottish Government's Sustainable Housing Strategy within which Scottish Government highlight a number of actions including making available £79m of funding for 2013-14 to establish the Home Energy Efficiency Programmes for Scotland (HEEPS).

The seminar will also include a number case studies from its peers on "innovation and new approaches" within the sectors. These will include:-
