From M60 North/South:

- Exit at junction 7 toward Altringham
- Follow the signs to Stretford/A56/Manchester and merge onto A56/Chester Road
- Continue to follow A56
- Trafford House will be on your left hand-side



Car parking facilities:

Delegates can park for free at Manchester United Football Ground, on **non-match days**, in car park E2.

Alternatively, delegates can use the parking facilities at the Lancashire County Cricket Club, which operates a pay on departure system. From the car park it is a 5 minute walk to Trafford House.

Tram

The closest Tram station is Old Trafford Station located 5-10 min walk from Trafford House. When leaving the station follow Warwick Road then turn left onto Chester Road. Trafford House will be located on your right hand side.
