

#### Public Bike Hire Scheme




- Launched in April 2015

- £20 per annum
- Success just past 100 000 trip taken within 6 months
- Changes the cultural and appearance of a city
- Welcomed by tourists and business people

- 5% all public vehicle sector vehicles will be ultra low emission by 2020.
- BCC have over 300 diesel / petrol fuelled vehicles
- 75 % grant funding infrastructure

### **Energy Security**


- 98% dependant on imported fossil fuel
- Highest utility prices in the UK
- 42 % Fuel poverty
- Industrial electricity prices 20% higher than neighbouring states. Uncompetitive
- Historically low oil prices
- Huge potential PV, biomass, biogas, AD


