#### HORSEMEAT SCANDAL

### Councils and agency probe school meals

#### Reassurances made as the row goes on

COUNCILS across the North East have been carrying out meeting there are no traces of horsement in their suppliers' products, including school meak.

As the horsement scandal continues, councils in the region are working with the Food Standards Agency (PSA) and contacting their suppliers to reasoure residents.

Following the revelation from Lan-

cashire County Council that cottage pictesting positive for horsement was delivered to schools in their area, Gateshead Council issued a statement reasoning parents that the meat products served in schools in its area do not contain horsement.

The council has confirmed that it has no direct or indirect link with the school supplier Compass Group or with any of the companies currently under investigation.

Dale Robuson, Service Director for Transport, Cleaning and Coloring at Gatehoad Ceaning, said: "I am happy to reassure parents the the firsh meat in mosh served in Gateshoad schools is locally-sourced and doer not contain horsement.

We use a highly-reputable Gausshead-based cattering butcher for all of our mest supplies. The mest they supply us with is locally-sourced and comes movely from farms in the North of

ingland via abattoirs which do not slaughter borses.

"As a result, we currently have no plans to remove basi from school menus"

The council made the announcement after parents asked for resourance that the products being served to their childern are not the same as those at the centre of recent investigations by the Food Standards Agency and major supermarkets.

Mr Robson added: "Parents rightly demand that we only serve high-quality and fully-traceable meat to their children that is prepared fresh each day. That's exectly what we do."

School meals are required by govermment to most satingent matritional anadards and that, Mr Robson said, usually peedudes using some of the highlypercessed products at the centre of the house DNA commontly.

Other councils across the region also told parents that they had received reassurances from their suppliers that products did not contain traces of horse meat.

Count james Blackburn, Perciolo Helder for City Services at Sunderland City Council, said "there are more than 1,000 school meals served up in primary schools daily acress the city, and many are meat-based. The council works closely with its suppliers and has received reassurances above the supply chain."

Don McLare, Ducham county Council's corporate director of resources, said We have sought and recrited assurances from all of our suppliers that there is no cause for concern re-

garding the products they provide." A spokeswimset for North "growide Council raid it had been in contact with the FSA but had not been instructed to take any action.

And a spolosmum for South Tyneside Catering Services said: "We have made all of the necessary stringent checks for councilerun schools, nursetia and care homes across the borough; and are saiiated with the quality assurance documentation from our mest surgiliers."

"We use very line processed or conventence foods, with most of our meshbeing cooled from raw ingredients and prepared by experienced professional contents."

Newcastle City Gound! confirmed it was one of the local authorities charged by the ESA to carry out an investigation of its area, although a spokesman stid he could not elaborate on the investigation.


