Project History A STRATEGIC RESPONSE TO THE CLIMATE EMERGENCY

- One Planet Cardiff and Climate Action Plans in place since early 2000's
 - Delivered retrofit programmes for estate (Salix/Re:Fit) and housing (ARBED), roof mounted renewables, river based hydro, waste and recycling transformation, energy innovation projects and Horizon 2020 projects etc
- Welsh Government Wellbeing of Future Generation Act
- The Council declared a Climate Change Emergency in 2019 (Member led)
- Welsh Government set an ambition for the Public Sector in Wales to be Carbon Neutral by 2030
 - = A NEW URGENCY AND STRENGTHENED COMMITTMENT
- "One Planet Cardiff" Strategy and Action Plan approved in Oct 21
- "Stronger, Fairer, Greener" May 22 Strengthened position on climate change issues (also Member led)




Strategy Development







2021/22 Carbon Emissions















Pathway to Net Zero Council
