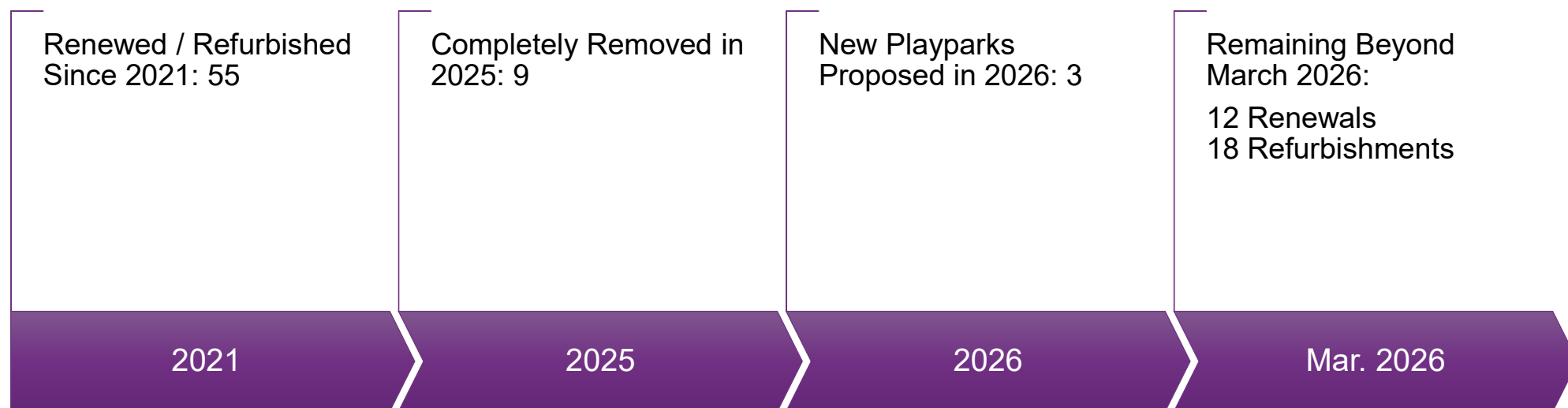

Total investment in playparks, outdoor gyms, skate and pump tracks from March 2021 – March 2026 approaching £5M.

Neurodivergent Communication Board



What is Neurodiversity?

Neurodivergence is the term for people whose brains function differently in one or more ways than is considered standard or typical. It refers to individuals who experience various conditions related to cognition and social ability, including autism, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), dyslexia, dyspraxia, obsessive compulsive disorder, Tourette's syndrome, Asperger's syndrome, and many others.

Why use communication boards?

Communication boards provide simple, recognisable images and symbols to allow understanding of one another. They help users express their immediate needs and preferences. These boards may increase autonomy by allowing users to make decisions about their own lives, as it allows them to communicate their needs to others more effectively.

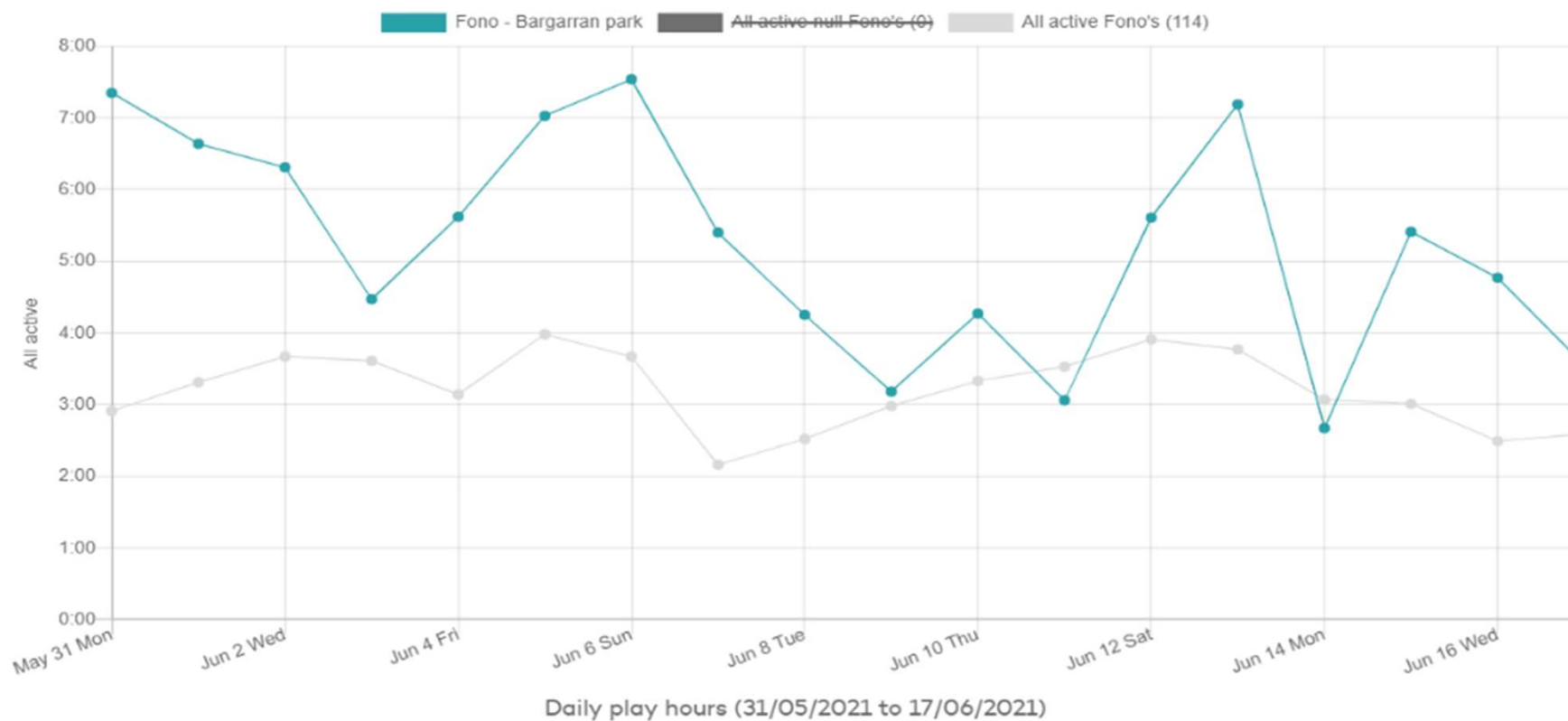
