The next municipal elections will be held in March 2020

In Paris and in many cities, cleanliness is considered as the most important subject for these elections.

A survey conducted in September 2019 lists the main problems of Parisians and **cleanliness is the most important** :

- Cleanliness is important for 69%
- pollution for 65%
- security for 63%
- taxes for 59%
- economic development and employment for 55%

This is not new but it is becoming more and more important.

In 2008, the problem already existed... That's why AVPU has been founded





LET ME TELL YOU ABOUT AVPU, WHAT IS AVPU ?

AVPU is the first network of cities dedicated only to urban cleanliness.

AVPU is a non-profit association, created in 2010. Magali Ordas, deputy mayor of Versailles is the president since the creation of the association.

Each city is represented by an elected representative and a territorial agent.

Actually 170 cities are members of the association.

Most cities over 100 000 inhabitants are members :

- Paris, Marseille, Nice, Toulouse, Strasbourg, Nantes, Montpellier...

Members could be mid-size cities or small cities, less than 5 000 inhabitants

Cities from Belgium, Switzerland and Luxembourg are also members :

- Bruxelles, Schaerbeek, Etterbeek, Liège, Namur, Genève and Luxembourg

The methodology of **Objective Indicators of Cleanliness (OIC)**


The measure of tomorrow – 20 years of benchmarking – APS

OIC methodology :

- It is a quantitative methodology, based on the counting of litter
- It is implemented by city agents : this is a self-evaluation
- Implemented on a sample of streets
- Each street chosen is measured in square meters
- The global counting is reported to a $100m^2$ ratio called “Average Indicator of littering” (AIL)




How delimitate sectors which have to be evaluated



example, this
sector measures
10 m long for each
sidewalk and 2.5 m
wide.

For both sidewalks,
the area is : 700 m X
2 m = 1,750 m²



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valuations are repeated each month on the
the sectors (from January to December).

valuations are carried out when the space has
been dirtiest, as far as possible from the
moment of cleaning.

Each quarter, cities send me their data and we
consolidate them.

An analysis is made and a report is sent to each
city which allows to note the most important
problems.



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The sectors are differentiated according to their uses:

- Commercial area
- Station (railway, bus or metro) area
- City hall and large equipment area
- Collective houses of city center area
- Collective houses of suburb area
- Schools area
- Parks and gardens
- Offices sector area
- Single houses sector area



Which litters are counting ?

HIGH SENSITIVITY LITTER

Dog fouling
Illegal deposit
Waste bag
Food and beverage packaging

MEDIUM SENSITIVITY LITTER

- Glass
- Papers
- Cigarette butts
- Organic food waste

LOW SENSITIVITY LITTER

- Graffiti
- Fly-posting
- Stains (oil, paint,...)
- Fallen leaves



After counting, a ratio is calculated : number of litter for 100 m²

- It is the Average Indicator of littering (AIL)


The average indicator littering is calculated for each litter

- For example : AIL for dog fouling in France is 0,10 for 100 m².
 - That means you see one dog fooling each 1000 m²

Comparisons could be made


- with other places in the same city
- with other cities in the same country or different country
- in 2018: 15,000 sites were evaluated in France and Belgium

What is the interest for cities?


To be able to relate to different averages

But also to evaluate progress or regressions on each theme over time



Versailles





Comparison of the city's AIL and AVPU's AIL, quarter by quarter.




The example of the city of Versailles




What is the problem for Versailles

Analysis of the components of the AIL in relative value :


Others are the most important AIL with 26 % of global AIL.






First most sensitive sector

“Collective uses of suburbia”, papers are most important litter.



Second most sensitive sector

"station area", flying is the most important litter : twice as important than city's average.
