
From April 2011, a cap on LHA was introduced at maximum rates of £250 per week for 1 bedroom, £290 per week for 2 bedrooms, £340 per week for 3 bedrooms and £400 per week for 4 or more bedrooms.

Almost half of the cuts are coming next year




Bedroom Tax is a small part of a much bigger cut

Notes: 'Other' category includes Benefit Cap, DLA, ESA, etc.
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
Total Housing Benefit Expenditure Real Terms (2012-13 prices)



Scottish Government Mitigation

- £40m with local government in 2013/14 and 2014/15 for council tax benefit
- £33m in 2013/14 and 2014/15 for Scottish Welfare Fund
- £20m for Discretionary Housing Payments in 2013/14.
- £35m for DHPs (and possibly an alternative scheme) in 2014/15
- £7m for welfare mitigation in each of the three years from 2013/14 to 2015/16 for advice and support services.
