








We have produced lower-level geographic estimates for Gross Value Added; Gross Domestic Household Income and Household Final Consumption Expenditure

## Snapshot of housing in Blackpool

- Private renting in Blackpool has increased by 5.7
  percentage points since 2011 <u>How life has changed in Blackpool</u>
- Stanley Park and Great Marton has a house price to income ratio of 2.8 - <u>Local Areas (MSOA)</u> and <u>Local</u> <u>Authority</u>
- Stanley Park and Great Marton has a median energy efficiency score of 62 - <u>Energy Efficiency of Housing</u>
- Blackpool has a higher number of short-term stays (Air B&E etc) compared to neighbouring areas <u>Short term lets</u>
   <u>through online collaborative economy platforms</u>
- Rental prices in Blackpool remain below the GB average -Private rent and house prices

#### In Blackpool:

House price £137,000

The average house price in Blackpool was £137,000 in August 2024 (provisional), up slightly 1.6% from August 2023. This was lower than the rise in the North West (4.6%) over the same period.

Monthly rent

£619

Private rents rose to an average of £619 in September 2024, an annual increase of 4.8% from £591 in September 2023. This was lower than the rise in the North West (9.3%) over the year.

First-time buyers

£122,000

The average price paid by first-time buyers was £122,000 in August 2024 (provisional). This was 1.8% higher than the average of £120,000 in August 2023 (revised).

For homes bought with a mortgage, the average house price was £143,000 in August 2024 (provisional). This was 1.7% higher than the average of £141,000 in August 2023 (revised).






Spending growth in Central Blackpool is similar to national average and has returned to pre-COVID level






### Spending in Central Blackpool comes from across the UK








### Central Blackpool sees a larger spike in seasonal international tourism spend compared to neighbours






