### Impact on Council housing departments

- Bedroom tax dominated debate so far
- Main impact revenue reductions

   (increased arrears -COSLA est. £15m
   pa) plus personal impact
- £6m support cost (money advice etc)
- Mitigated (but not wholly) by DHPs
- No comprehensive research yet on financial and other impacts (COSLA say £100m)

### Impact on council housing departments (2)

Potential revenue impacts (short, medium, long) reflected in amended HRA Business Plans

Key impacts could be :

- Service reductions (new duties?)
- New build plans reduced or shelved
- Above inflation rent increases
- More "efficiencies" or job losses

#### WR & temporary accommodation

Importance of TA in context of 2012 homelessness commitment (5270 LA units excl. hostels)

#### Issues

- TA also subject to bedroom tax
- Under UC change to funding basis from HB for actual cost to LHA (+ £45 management fee)
- COSLA est. costs at £25million
- Impact too on supported accom.

#### Impact on *people*

- Bedroom tax bad enough but impact of other benefit changes may be worse
- E.G.
- Changes to disability benefits (DLA to PIP)
- Suspensions of existing benefits e.g. JSA (55,000 in Scotland)
- Mitigation via DHPs, SWF, food banks?
- Single people may be coming off worst
- threat of evictions and homelessness
- councils a key bulwark to mitigate impacts

#### Impact of Universal Credit

- Significant delays & on-going problems, but UC will still happen, & some big issues for us
- Key challenge is switch to direct rent payments
   (COSLA est. £50million at risk before safeguards)
- Tenants without bank accounts (financial inclusion)role for CU's?
- or budgeting skills (tenancy sustainment & avoiding eviction /homelessness)
- Employability (for tenants able to work or coming off disability benefits)
- "Life will not be the same again. We need to wake up and smell the coffee!" DCHA UC pilot

### What should Councils be doing to plan ahead? (or, you ain't seen nothin' yet)

- Scale of challenge SG est. £4.5billion lost from Scottish economy by 14/15!
- Cuts only 25% so far (and 45% next year)
- Generate long term support mechanisms
- Redouble efforts re TA & SA (outsource ?)
- Greater emphasis on *employability & financial inclusion* needs, & effective links with appropriate services
- better links & info exchange with DWP

engage with tenants, and identify most vulnerable (not as easy as it sounds !)
