## **MOT Appeals & Complaints**

Local appeals came in on 28th February 2022, allowing you to ask DVSA to review part of a test or the test result, without having to make a statutory appeal.

## Making a local appeal: You can either:

- email technicalofficers@dvsa.gov.uk
- phone DVSA's Customer Service Centre (0300 123 9000, option 1)

The local appeal should be made within 2 working days of the test result. If made by email, to include:

- the vehicle registration/trailer ID and VIN number
- the date and time of test
- the ATF name
- the address and phone number of the presenter/operator
- details of the disagreement and the customer's name and address

DVSA will contact you within 2 days to arrange a reinspection (if one is needed) and aim to complete the local appeal within 5 days. A report will be produced, with either the original decision standing, or a new decision – the outcome will be recorded against the vehicle or trailer and sent to the person who made the appeal.



This will invalidate your appeal

## Braking performance assessment requirements from April 2025

There is an expectation that every safety inspection will include a **brake performance assessment** using either:

- A Roller Brake Tester
- A suitable electronic brake performance monitoring system (EBPMS), or
- A decelerometer with temperature readings.

If EBPMS is not used, it is expected there is a minimum of **four laden brake tests** per annum.

Where laden brake tests are not carried out, then a risk assessment must be available.

If EBPMS used, report must be evaluated before safety inspection, signed, dated, and retained.

Brake tests can be conducted up to 14 days before the safety inspection date – to allows operators to conduct a laden brake tests during the vehicle/trailer normal activities, without the need to specially load it
