





Your green bin will now be collected once every three weeks.

Changes to your waste collection service

What's changing?

- Your green bin collection will NOW change from EVERY WEEKS TO EVERY WEEKS.
- All other recycling collections will remain the same.
- Food waste will be collected every week in the grey food caddy.
 The blue bin, brown bin, black box and textile bag will be collected every two weeks.

This change gives important benefits to the Council and our communities. By recycling more we can reduce costs and help the environment.

Why the change?

- Sending waste to landfill cost Falkirk Council £2.3 million in 2012/13 equating to approximately £8,000 per day.
- If there is no reduction in the amount of waste being sent to landfill, this cost will rise this year to £2.7 million equating to approximately £10,000 per day.
- Scotland has ambitious targets to recycle 60% of the waste we generate by 2020 and, with your help, we can achieve this.

How can you help?

Did you know in 2013 **60% of items** we sent to landfill actually **could have been recycled?**

Our recent waste surveys show that the average green bin contained items that could have been recycled using the services provided:













That's why we need you to recycle as much as possible and reduce the amount of waste in your green bin.

To help you recycle more, additional recycling containers including grey food caddies, larger blue bins, black boxes and textile bags are all available free of charge.



Food Waste

For all types of food waste

Collected every week

32% of material landfilled in 2013 was food waste that should have been recycled using the grey food caddy.

Top tip You can even recycle meat and bones



Use any plastic bag, compostable liner or newspaper in your kitchen caddy



Put all cooked and uncooked food waste into your kitchen caddy



When the liner is almost full, tie and remove it from the kitchen caddy



Place the full liner in your kerbside caddy



Place your kerbside caddy at the kerbside on your collection day and we will collect it every week



All types of food waste - cooked and uncooked

- Dairy and eggshells
- Fish, meat and bones
- Fruit and vegetables (and peelings)
- Bread and cakes

- ✓ Rice, pasta and pizza
- Tea bags and coffee grounds
- Pet foods
- Unpackaged out of date food

Use any plastic bag, compostable liner or newspaper to line your kitchen caddy

Will the food in my caddy smell?

If you use your service as shown above with liners, tie them when full, and close and lock your caddy lids (by putting the handle in the forward or upright position) there should not be a problem with smell.



Blue Bin

Paper, metal, cardboard and clean plastic containers

Top tip

of material landfilled in 2013

You can even recycle empty aerosols and detergent bottles

Collected every weeks



Collect and sort your materials for recycling



Rinse your cans, tins and plastic bottles, trays and tubs



Flatten your cardboard and plastic bottles



A Place your paper, cans, tins, cardboard and clean plastic bottles, trays and tubs into your blue bin



5 Place your blue bin at the kerbside on your collection day and we will collect it every two weeks

Black Box and Textile Bag

Glass, small electrical items, batteries, clothing, shoes and textiles

Top tip

You can even recycle shoes and toasters

Collected every weeks

of material **landfilled** in 2013 should have been recycled using the black box and textile bag.



Collect and sort your materials for recycling



2 Place any glass bottles and jars into your black box



Place any small electrical items including any batteries into your black box



Place any clothes, textiles and shoes tied in pairs into the textile baa



Place your black box and textile bag at the kerbside on your collection day and we will collect them every two weeks



Glass bottles and jars

- ✓ Wine bottles
- Beer bottles
- ✓ Juice bottles
- Cooking sauce jars
- Jam jars
- Baby food jars

Small electrical items

- Hairdryers and radios
- Irons, kettles and toasters
- Household batteries
- ✓ Electrical toys
- ✓ Electric tools

Clothing, other textiles and shoes

- ✓ Clothing
- Towes
- ✓ Blankets and curtains
- Shoes and trainers (fied in pairs)
- Handbags and belts

- Glass cookware, e.g. Pyrex
- Window/flat glass
- Broken glass
- Drinking glasses
- Duvets

Your brown bin is collected from March to November - check your calendar for details.

Top tip

Take any excess garden waste to your local Recycling Centre at Roughmute, Bonnybridge or Kinneil Kerse, Bo'ness where it will be recycled

Any item that can be recycled

The waste in the green bin is sent to landfill. 60% of this waste could have been recycled but was landfilled at a cost to the Council of £1.4 million in 2013.



Top tip

You can also recycle energy efficient light bulbs, car batteries, wood, and much more at your local recycling centres

Why is recycling important?

By recycling, together we can save money, support jobs and protect the environment

- The materials we throw away are valuable and recycling helps the economy by creating jobs locally as well as in the Scottish recycling industry.
- Recycling is more efficient it uses less energy and reduces the carbon emissions compared to using raw materials.
- Recycling reduces the demand for raw materials, helping to protect natural habitats.
- Sending waste to landfill cost Falkirk Council £2.3 million in 2012/13.
 This figure could have been reduced by £1.4 million if all recycling services had been used to their full potential.

The cost of landfilling materials that could have been recycled is the same as the combined costs of:

- One year's running costs for 10 nursery classes;
- One year's support for 10 teenagers in foster care placements; and
- One year's care in a residential home for 10 elderly people.
