National Food Crime Unit: Origins

Elliott Review into the Integrity and Assurance of Food Supply Networks (The Elliott Review) published in July 2014

- Triggered by horse meat crisis in 2013
- Recommended the creation of a Food Crime Unit which would
 - Take the lead in the collection, analysis and distribution of information and intelligence from a wide range of sources... acting as an 'intelligence hub'.
 - Develop a model for co-ordination of high profile investigations and enforcement and facilitate arrangements to deal effectively with food crime



WHAT IS FOOD CRIME?

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1. Serious or complex fraud

2. Serious or complex dishonest regulatory non-compliance.



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
The Offending Pyramid

Support


- Provide advice and guidance to partners to help them meet their own objectives by working in partnership
- Provide subject matter expertise and access to specialist resources or services

Coordinate

• Bring together partner agencies to coordinate the most effective response to threats and opportunities


