 26 councils reduced to 11 new "supercouncils"



Mid Ulster


North Down and Ards



# Planning Functions which Transferred to Council

- Local Development Planning
- **Development Management** all planning applications currently in the system, excluding regionally significant applications.
- Enforcement all breaches of planning control.



### Role of the LDP

1. Framework to guide planning decisions & provide certainty

2. Assist statutory undertakers in planning for service provision

3. Implement regional policy (RDS, SPPS & Sustainable Development Strategy) at the local level

"Mid and East Antrim will be shaped by high quality, sustainable and connected places for people to live, work, enjoy, invest and visit, so as to improve the quality of life for all"







# Planning Applications Who will determine them?

- Regionally Significant Applications
   Department for Infrastructure
- All the rest (Major & Local)
   Mid and East Antrim Borough Council





# Who in Mid and East Antrim Borough Council will decide applications?

- The Planning Committee will decide all major planning applications, all applications made by the council and applications submitted by Planning Officers and Heads of Service
- All local development applications whether for approval or refusal are delegated to Officers, with a number of exceptions
- Approximately 90% of applications are delegated.



- The Planning Committee meets on a monthly basis
- The Planning Committee comprises of 12 Members
- Planning Committee meetings take place in the Council Chamber, the Braid, Ballymena

## Can public lobby Council Members?

 YES – preferably those Members not on the Planning Committee. If a Committee Member wishes to speak in support or against an application in order to influence the decision they must declare an interest and not vote on the application.

 Members can address the Planning Committee as per the agreed protocol.

 Such addresses will be limited to 4 minutes and where more than one Member wants to speak on an argument they will be asked to split the time.


### **Development Management Overview**

- 303 Planning Applications transferred to Mid and East Antrim from the DOE
- 892 Applications were received 2015/2016
- 937 Applications were received 2016/2017
- 997 Applications were received 2017/2018
- 59 Planning Appeals since transfer
- 39 Planning Appeals dismissed
- 15 Planning Appeals allowed

### Planning Performance

- Statutory targets:
- 1. Major Planning Applications (average processing time 30 weeks)
- 2. Local Planning Applications (average processing time 15 weeks)
- Mid and East Antrim
- 1. Major Applications 26 weeks (NI Average 59 weeks)
- 2. Local Applications 7 weeks (NI Average 15 weeks)

95% Planning Applications Approved



### Economic Development Emerging Issues:

- How Much Land is Needed for Economic Development?
- Is there a need for Offices / Where should they be located?
- Should other non-industrial uses be allowed on zoned sites?
- What type and scale of economic development /tourism development is appropriate in the Countryside?

- Ensure ample supply of land to meet economic development needs
- Safeguard land for economic development
- Promote and protect the economy of Town
   Centres
- Promote tourism
- Support local industry
- Development of infrastructure
- Sustainable transport policy
- Protect the environment
