# Why measure performance?



- Meeting national requirements
  - Secure continuous improvement
  - Set improvement objectives
- Setting realistic improvement targets
- Evidencing the value of services, improving services
- Management information e.g. budget setting
- Creating a performance management culture
- Developing an overview of your services (strengths/weaknesses) over time and in comparison with others
- Measuring efficiencies, value for money and competitiveness
- Self assessment/monitoring
- Driving improvement: learning from others/best performers

## PN transport model



- Contract maintenance hire charge Supply and maintain vehicle
- Annual maintenance cost per weighted vehicle
- Percentage of maintenance cost attributable to non fair wear and tear
- Labour input hours per weighted vehicle performance indicators
- No of weighted vehicle (units) maintained per fitter per annum
- Percentage staff absence (fitters / tradesmen)
- Number of days hire vehicles' used (per vehicle on fleet) to cover for vehicles in workshop
- Quality assurance and consultation
- Human resources and people management
- Good practice and consultation
- Percentage of vehicles passing DVA test first time
- Percentage of vehicles passing DVA test first time (DVA statistics)
- Percentage of vehicles serviced within 7 days of schedule
- Percentage of all workshop jobs completed within 24 hours
- Percentage of council vehicles requiring an Operators Licence
- Number of PG9 notices issued by DVA per 100 council vehicles

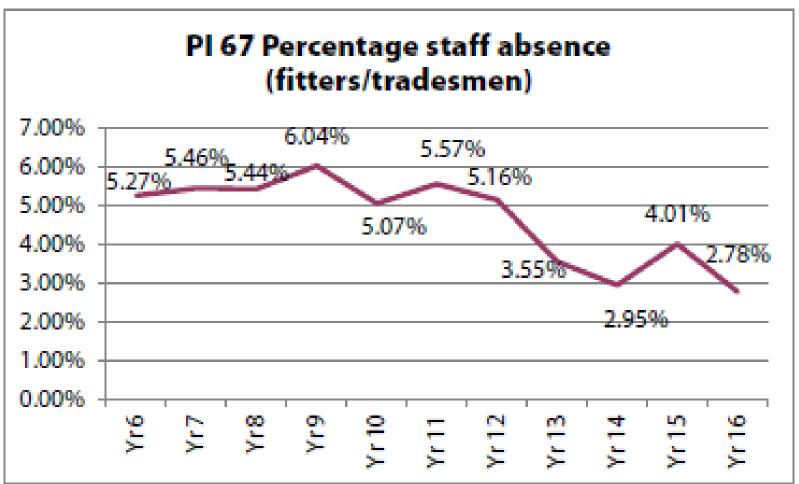

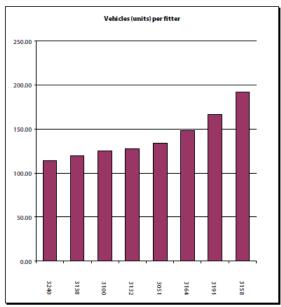
